BBSC Minutes of Meeting

November 7, 2023

The meeting was attended by about 18 members and one guest, Eliana Dykehouse. I failed to make a head count, so 18 is just a guess.

Location of the meeting was the Masonic Lodge in Alpine. The meeting was called to order at 6:02pm by president Jim Westermann. John O Hollis gave the invocation.

Reports

The October 3rd minutes were read by Scott McClanahan. John O Hollis motioned to accept and Clifton seconded, and the minutes were accepted.

Liz Measures read the treasurer's report. Expenses include \$2000 to the Alpine Christian School for their raffle prize. \$250 income came from shotgun rounds. 56 new members signed up in October, we currently have 273 members, up from 270 last year. Howard Smith motioned to accept the treasurer report, and Roger Amis seconded. The report was accepted.

Old Business

The club donated the turkey shoot skeet rounds to the Sul Ross Range and Wildlife Club.

The trap house roof is done, thanks to Gabi and Phil O'Shaughnessy volunteer efforts and donated sheet metal from Sylvia and Joel Nelson. Phil ordered trap machine parts to fix throwing two clays at once in the high and low houses.

Archery took a step forward with Ralph Gruebel getting certified for Boy Scout archery merit badge. Nick Harrison is a 4H firearms instructor. Luke Hendryx let the club know the only 4H club is in Valentine, too far for shooting events.

Eliana Dykehouse reported on the turkey shoot in October. There were 20 plus participants with \$100 profit. John O Hollis motioned to donate \$1000 to the Sul Ross Range and Wildlife Club. Robert Johnson seconded and was accepted. We will create a document to help next year's RWC president plan the 2024 event.

Ralph Gruebel prepared maps of the range site and recommended a road along the back of the main berm to the shotgun range with parking. A decision was made to close the rifle range during shotgun events, and park on the rifle range near the benches.

New Business

The club received a plaque of appreciation from the American Legion.

Robert Johnson will monitor the club's Facebook page. Social media falls under range safety. Everyone on the club's Facebook page must be 18 or older. Steel targets may offer rimfire silhouette targets on Saturdays.

Lt Kirk Caughman would like to offer APD scenario stages at the range for members.

We would like to start a program for new gun owners to have a volunteer mentor from the club membership.

Guest speakers after the meeting are in the works. Mike Boren recommends watching videos from <u>Andrew F. Branca</u>. Mr. Branca is unique in that he creates videos for each state's laws. He is also highly recommended by Massad Ayoob.

The Veterans Day programs at the American Legion and Alpine High School were mentioned.

Mike Boren recommended a member only swap meet. Roger Amis will check with Masons. We will define safety procedures, checking guns, and exclude ammunition with firearms present. Members can trade or sell firearms, knives, reloading gear, hunting gear, and shooting gear. We will call this a Rendezvous.

Roger Amis motioned to adjourn at 6:55pm and Clifton seconded.
