BBSC Minutes of Meeting

March 5, 2024

The meeting was attended by 10 members and no guests.

Location of the meeting was the Masonic Lodge in Alpine. The meeting was called to order at 6:05pm by president Jim Westermann. John O Hollis gave the invocation.

Reports

The February 6th minutes were read by Scott McClanahan. Roger Amis motioned to accept and Robert Johnson seconded, and the minutes were accepted.

Liz Measures read the treasurer's report. Three regular bills of dumpster, telephone, and electricity paid. \$882 paid for steel targets. \$1460 paid for clay targets.

49 paid members brining total to 399. 409 this time last year. John O Hollis motioned to accept, and Ralph Gruebel seconded, the treasurer report was accepted.

Old Business

Phil O'Shaughnessy reported on shotgun about mounting manual traps at the range for people to use their own clays and use for sporting clays. Ralph Gruebel motioned to place them and Robert Johnson seconded. The motion passed. Rounds of skeet and trap are now \$5.

Ralph Gruebel reported on archery. Signs for rules were created. There are no archery events yet. The range is getting used. A survey about archery will be sent to BBSC members. The Boy Scouts are waiting on certification of adults. Luke Hyndrix is interested in archery. Ralph asked about a storage container for the 4H. The storage of 22 rifles in a container is an issue.

The port-a-potty service stopped when the owner had a major health problem. The company hired someone, so we will continue getting service from the same company.

New Business

The Big Bend Shooting Foundation is sponsoring a shooting school at the Buffalo Trail Scout Ranch. They would like a pallet of clay targets donated by the BBSC and two left-handed shotguns. There will be three camps with 300 kids per week. The kids go on pack trips in surrounding ranches. The BBSF is also looking for volunteers to organize the annual banquet.

The next BBSC Rendezvous, renamed 2A Swap Meet, will be in May and a date picked at the next meeting.

Kyp Angel reported finding an empty 6-pack of beer in the Pistol #1 trash can. Scott McClanahan reported on the fire February 14th based on many emails and reports. The Fire Chief doesn't know what caused the fire near the range, but it was reported quickly and put out. Precautions will be taken by the BBSC. Vegetation on the far side of the berm will be removed. Members should be aware of what to do if a fire is spotted. Something small on a calm day could be contained with bucket and shovel, but a windy day requires calling or going for help immediately.
