BBSC Minutes of Meeting December 3rd, 2024

The meeting was attended by 15 members and no guests. Location of the meeting was the Masonic Lodge in Alpine. The meeting was called to order at 6:03pm by president Jim Westermann. Invocation was by a member I failed to identify.

Reports

The November 5th minutes were read by Scott McClanahan. Ralph Gruebel motioned to accept and Roger Amis seconded, the minutes were accepted.

Liz Measures read the treasurer's report. 36 new members. 343 members total this year, 310 members at this time last year. Expenses included \$450 for steel target welding. Motion to accept by James Webb, second by Roger Amis.

Monty Kimball reported the ACS is done shooting until January. The roof on the high house is done. Shotgun range ready to set up more machines for sporting clays. Want to buy a Shotkam for training ACS students.

No Turkey Shoot report. No matching funds done.

New Business

Second Amendment donations were voted on and passed, presented by Jim Westermann. The donations are \$1000 each to four organizations:

1. Gun Owners of America
2. Texas State Rifle Association
3. Second Amendment Foundation
4. Firearms Policy Coalition

The NRA-ILA received \$500. Motion by Roger Amis and second by Robert Johnson.

Jim Westermann presented a letter from the ACS for the BBSC purchasing the gun for their raffle, and signed by all the teachers and staff. Roger Amis motioned to fund the next gun raffle for \$2,000, and Robert Johnson seconded.

Old Business

The 3 Gun event will use profits to buy targets. A discussion followed about how many BBSC members participated with a goal of 50%. There was a \$10 discount for BBSC members. The events needs 20 participants with 80 the registration limit. Monty motioned to accept all dates requested for 3 Gun, and Phil O'Shaughnessy seconded. The dates in 2025 are 3-22, 4-19, 5-10, 6-21, 7-19, and 9-20.

Roger Amis motioned to adjourn at 6:45pm and Robert Johnson seconded.
